

BURIAL OPTIONS

In-Ground

Cherokee Memorial Park has a number of Gardens to choose from offering a variety of spaces in a park-like setting. Single burial sites, side-by-sides and double-depth lawn crypts are available. The latter option allows two vaults to be placed one above the other. Besides conserving land, it saves money by enabling you to purchase the outer burial containers before need.

Mausoleum Entombment

The spectacular Sierra View Mausoleum is a prestigious complex that offers single crypts and a variety of companion crypts to meet your particular needs. The Sunrise Room is a community room with space for 64 entombments and is decorated with luxurious marbles and granites. Two private rooms, which have been designed specifically for individual families, are entered through vine-covered iron gates. The Chapel of Flowers brings nature indoors with an atrium design featuring fountains, trees and award-winning stained glass windows.

Cremation

At Cherokee Memorial Park cremated remains can be placed in a variety of settings. Cast bronze urns in glass-fronted niches, urn gardens in rock-walled flowerbeds, granite and marble-fronted niches both inside and outside are scattered throughout the park with some including marble statuary. Other areas include a garden beside a rushing stream waterfall or scattered in Cascade Garden next to the waterfall.

MEMORIAL OPTIONS

Benches

Cherokee Memorial Park is pleased to provide a peaceful atmosphere where visitors can enjoy the natural beauty of their surroundings while savoring precious memories. To give them an opportunity to sit and reflect, polished granite benches are located throughout our memorial gardens. These benches can be dedicated to an individual or family, and serve as a lasting reminder to loved ones and respite for all who pass by. Traditionally, the family name is incised

along the front edge of the seat, and an optional bronze plaque bearing individual names can be placed at the base of the bench. You can choose a location near flowerbeds and blooming shrubs, along a walkway or beneath a spreading canopy of trees. The benches have been expressly designed for Cherokee and are available in multiple colors.

Markers

Cherokee Memorial offers multiple types of memorialization for your loved one. As a traditional Memorial Park, Cherokee has only allowed flat markers in both bronze and granite. However, in our newest gardens, Heritage and Grace, we now offer an upright or above-ground monuments which are reminiscent of old world cemeteries. Bordering the new gardens, the Heritage Garden Estates allow for beautiful private memorial estates with upright markers in combination with bronze in-ground memorialization.

Trees

Established in 1983, our Memorial Tree program has been met with great enthusiasm. This is your opportunity to create a majestic living memorial - a symbol that will stand as an eternal tribute to your loved one. What's more, you can realize significant savings by arranging for both memorial property and a living memorial in advance of need.

Flower Policy

All flowers, both fresh and artificial, are removed weekly. Areas south of West Drive are serviced on Wednesdays; areas north of West Drive are serviced on Thursdays. A Holiday Removal Schedule may be obtained from the office. Mylar balloons are not permitted.

GRAVESITE ITEM RESTRICTIONS

Item not allowed on Gravesites

- Alcohol. Firearms & Ammunition
- Mular balloons
- Open flame candles or barbecues
- Food or Drinks of any kind
- Wire, wooden fences, garland, flowers or other items used to outline the graves or markers.
- No more than 6 items / Not over 18" tall

Any item above is subject to immediate removal by our staff.

Veterans Memorialization

Veterans can be remembered in a variety of ways at Cherokee Memorial Park. The Eagle Memorial, the first feature erected in our Veterans' Garden, located in the Garden of Trees, is a magnificent cast-bronze sculpture poised atop a granite pedestal. Five sides of this hexagon bear medallions that represent each branch of military service. The sixth side affords space to mount individual scrolls featuring the name, dates of birth and death of the veteran you would like to remember. Our Court of Valor is a distinguished, commemorative area marked by four bronze memorial plaques that include the names of veterans of World War II. the Korean War, the Vietnam War, and Women in the Military. The Purple Heart Dedication Memorial serves as a tribute to those veterans who have been wounded or killed in action against an enemy of the United States and includes an area where your individual memorial scroll can be added. In keeping with our focus on veterans, we also offer memorial benches and trees to honor those who served in the military. Another bronze eagle is the centerpiece in the Garden of Freedom that has a wingspan of 10 feet with an American Flag in its talons. Just taking flight over a granite waterfall. Sentinel rows of granite niches are reserved for veterans, fire, police and ambulance personnel as well as those patriotic citizens who love their country. In addition, you are welcome to display your veteran's commemorative flag in our annual Avenue of Flags—an event paying tribute to veterans on Memorial Day. Regardless of the location of your loved one's burial site, our park offers a diversity of ways to remember that special veteran forever.
